Bryston can now present a complete system (lacking only a turntable). The one being demoed featured the Model T Signature speakers, the same as the system at the last Montreal show (EDIT – 7B's used in Toronto instead of 28B's).

The system had the same lively, dynamic sound and excellent imaging.



With their preamp and power amplifier models well established in the marketplace, Bryston has turned their attention to their digital products. The latest such product is the Bryston Optical Transport (BOT-1), which adds CD ripping and playback when connected to the Bryston Digital Player (BDP-2). "No Computer Necessary," says the product literature, which I think is great. Price hasn't been determined yet, but I'm told it's going to be less than \$1000. I've included a pair of Grado headphones in the photo just to show how compact the BOT-1 is.
